∩6 **Teams & Divisions**

With some age groups and aged divisions having only a few teams nominated the Committee may be required to combine ages and/or divisions. This is done to ensure each team has a minimum of five games over the weekend.

If two age divisions are combined i.e. 55s and 50's neither age division will be disadvantaged - at the end of the round games the top two teams at the Over 50's will play the final and the top two teams at the Over 55's will play their final (unless the 55's want to challenge for the 50's trophy).

For example, if after the round games we have placing such as A/50 1st, C/55 2nd, B/50 3rd, G/55 4th then the A/50s vs B50/s for the O50 final and C/55 vs G/55 for the O55 final.

The Orange Women's Masters have been able to attend the State Championships since their inception and over the years have grown from taking one team away to taking up to eight teams away and being represented in each age division. Our original team are now in the O55s.

Being in a central location Orange have had the ability to attend all the Full and Half State Championships when they are close by or an extra days travel away... So how do we do it?

- We fundraise: Orange Women's Masters are very fortunate to be able to provide the food and beverages at the annual Gnoo Blah Classic car show held in Orange annually. The Women Masters volunteer their weekend to cook on the BBQ, serve hot dogs and make up to 100 lunches for car members racing on the Sunday. This weekend of work allows Orange to subsidise the cost of our bus, accommodation and players attending the Championships, bringing in \$5,000 7,000 on average. It's a long day, but it's a great catch up at the beginning of the season and there are many hands on deck to help.
- Orange try to keep their range of packages under \$300 be it to attend Parkes, Taree, Armidale or Coffs Harbour.
- As soon as the venue for the next year is known our players are told (on the bus)
 as well as being posted on our Orange Women's Masters Facebook page. This
 allows players to start their saving and to book in their annual leave requirements
 or whoever for child minding.
